Catrin is a welsh name and is due to my mother's heritage and with my Dad being from Essex, they were the original Gavin and Stacy. I was born and bred just outside of Liverpool and was brought up bilingual Welsh and English. I originally went to Leeds Metropolitan University studying Counselling and Therapeutic Studies but I ended up working as a Youth worker where I combined both my love of youth work with my faith. I went on to do further training in youth work and Community Evangelism in Chester. 8 years ago I moved to Sutton in South London to work with Sutton School Work, a Christian charity where I took the gospel message into 18 schools across the area.

It is Sutton that I explored God's call to the ministry. After being accepted by Southwark diocese I trained at Cranmer Hall, Durham. I have just completed 2 years of study and am frantically getting everything ready to make the move to Buxton.
