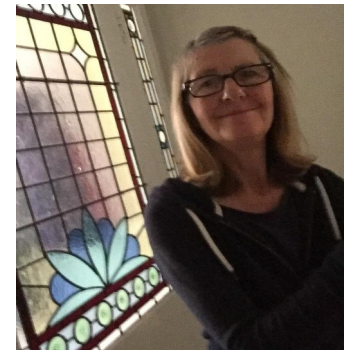

CLERGY LETTER—OCTOBER

Dear Friends,

“Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!”
(2 Corinthians 9:15)

Do you remember those pictures of Pope John Paul II on his travels, before he became so disabled, kneeling to kiss the ground as he arrived at each foreign airport? It was the Pope’s sign of respect for the land he was visiting. A country is not just its people. It is “our bit of earth” (John Habgood). And like the people who live on it, the earth needs to be respected and cherished.

This is a harvest theme, though not a very common one. Nowadays, and increasingly in towns and cities, the meaning of harvest has been interpreted almost entirely in terms of production, even sometimes as no more than a celebration of the world of work. This too is an important theme for our worship, but it is about the world we make for ourselves. Harvest, as I see it, is more about our dependence on the earth.

It is worth thinking for a moment or two about the difference between “earth” and “world”. We talk about many possible worlds, but only one Planet Earth. Earth is our home, the name of the place where we live. We have maps of the world, divided up into countries and places. But earth is the ground itself, the soil on which all life depends. Think of the subtle difference between describing someone as “earthy”, and describing them as “worldly”. Or the difference between “getting down to earth” and “coming down in the world”. The world is organised. The earth simply is. In Hebrew the word for soil is *adamah*, from which we get Adam. In Latin it is *humus*, from which we get “human” and “humility”. There is something basic about earth, about having one’s feet on the ground.

The Very Revd Dr Stephen Hance writes...



As announced, I am leaving the Diocese of Derby to take on the role of National Lead for Evangelism and Witness for the Church of England.

This is a full-time post based at Church House Westminster

with responsibility for the Church's goals around evangelism - to motivate the million Anglican church-goers to share their faith, to equip a thousand new evangelists, and to enable clergy to lead evangelistic churches.

It has been a privilege to be Dean here for the last two years, and while I am moving on sooner than I had expected, I am grateful for all that we have accomplished together.

Among other things, I am glad to have been able to play a part in welcoming Bishop Libby to Derby, as a member of the Vacancy-in-See committee, Chair of the Statement of Needs Drafting Group, a member of the Crown Nominations Commission, and then with the Cathedral's role in electing and installing our new Bishop to her See.

In the Cathedral, we have opened Derby Cathedral School, launched The Sanctuary at Derby Cathedral, received a substantial grant from the Church Commissioners to ensure the future sustainability of the Cathedral, and made some significant new staff appointments, for all of which thanks be to God.

In my new role I will be working in the areas of evangelism, discipleship, and church growth, which have been particular hallmarks of Archbishop Justin's time in office. This is an exciting time to be involved in this work, with a renewed commitment from the Church at all levels to enable evangelism that is motivated not by institutional anxiety about diminishing numbers gathering on a Sunday, but about a longing for every person in our society to know the love of God for themselves. I am glad that this work will bring me back to the Diocese of Derby from time to time.

Please pray for me as I will continue to pray for you.

Revd Canon Dr Elizabeth Thomson named Acting Dean

Bishop Libby is pleased to announce that the Revd Canon Dr Elizabeth Thomson will be Acting Dean of Derby from 30 September 2019. Canon Elizabeth has been at Derby Cathedral since 2014 as Canon Missioner, and was appointed sub-dean by the outgoing dean, the Very Revd Dr Stephen Hance.

On making the announcement, Bishop Libby said: "We are very thankful that Elizabeth is willing to take on this crucial role during the vacancy. Elizabeth has a proven track record of leadership and creative ministry in the cathedral. I am confident she will not only love and support the cathedral through this time of transition, but bring her gifts and experience to enabling the Cathedral to flourish and grow during this time."



And there is comfort, too, in the very soil itself, in getting one's hands dirty.

So perhaps Harvest time can help to remind us of our earthiness. Faith is not just about highly moral or spiritual matters. We can't all the time be like William Wordsworth, feeling "the joy of elevated thoughts". Earth speaks to us about the very conditions for being human. We are made from dust, and to dust we shall return.

The reminder is all the more important because so much of modern life distances us from this sense of dependence on the earth, and from the sheer givenness of nature. We live in an increasingly man-made environment, much of it now covered with tarmac. And we worry about it. GM crops, the plight of many farmers, the gulf in understanding between town and country, and many more examples, are all symptoms of something wrong in the way we earth ourselves, as it were, in what should be basic to our humanness.

But even the earth itself is not reliable. Witness the recurrent famines in Africa. A sequence of earthquakes in Surrey (felt around the county in July 2018) can dent our confidence in what we normally think of as the bedrock of stability. Yet paradoxically, instability is also a necessary condition for life. It drives us to go beyond ourselves. Also, think of the dangerous extent to which land itself can become an obsession. It is a major cause of wars and revolutionary struggles. There is a large cultural element in such wars, of course, a large slice of "world" as well as "earth", but in the end it is "our bit of earth" which focuses the conflict.

As with all God's gifts, there is ambivalence in our relationship with the earth. To love and cherish it can bring both good and evil. To possess and enjoy something can be good in

itself. What else are we supposed to do but enjoy a “land flowing with milk and honey” (Deuteronomy 31:20)?

But it carries dangers. Hence, there are constant warnings in the Book of Deuteronomy against complacency. The Israelites found it all too easy, once they had reached the Promised Land, to forget the God who had brought them there.

Hence, too, the constant need for rituals and offerings to orient ourselves rightly, the constant reminders of the perils of selfishness and forgetfulness. And in the New Testament, we find the same. In his Second Letter to the Corinthians, St Paul makes the point that we need scope for generosity if we are truly to live by the belief that the earth and all that it brings forth is not ours, but God’s (cf. 2 Corinthians 9:6-15).

Prosperity always carries responsibilities. To ignore them is a recipe for disaster. The antidote to both complacency and selfishness is thanksgiving. We begin where we are – creatures of earth; dependent on the earth; creatures entrusted with huge powers to make it beautiful, or to lay waste to it; to be selfish with it, or generous. But thanksgiving focuses our attention on the earth as a gift, rather than a possession; on the giver more than on the gift itself; and on the glorious interplay of giving and receiving which lies at the heart of life, love and worship.

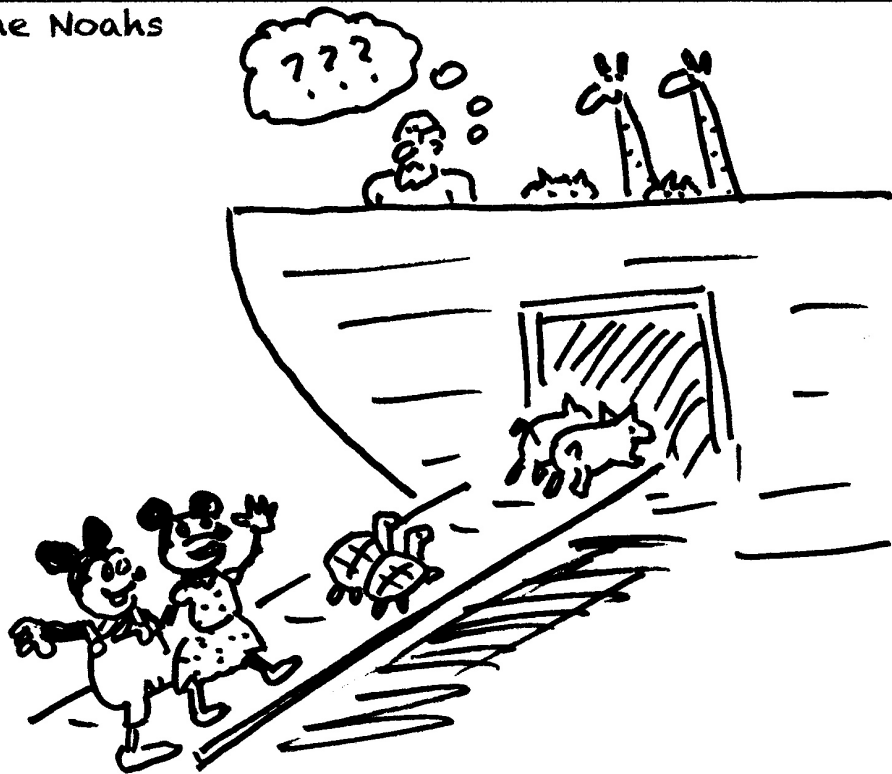
